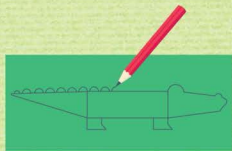


Printed crocodile



Don't cover the crocodile's head.



Make sure you brush paint on all the bumps.

1. Draw a rectangle on green paper for a crocodile's body. Add two legs and a long tail. Draw the head with bumps for the eye and nostril. Add more little bumps along its back.

2. Cut out the crocodile and turn it over. Cut a rectangle of bubble wrap that is big enough to cover the crocodile's body, tail and legs, like this.

3. To print spots on the crocodile, lay the bubble wrap on an old newspaper, with the bumps facing up. Brush bright green paint all over the bubble wrap.



Rubbing the bubble wrap helps to print the paint onto the crocodile.



Hold the crocodile with one hand as you peel off the bubble wrap.



4. Lay the crocodile on some newspaper. Then, lay the bubble wrap, with the bumps facing down, over the crocodile again. Press it down, then rub it gently.

5. Starting at one end, carefully peel the bubble wrap off the crocodile without smudging the spots. Then, leave the paint to dry completely.

6. Draw an eye and a line for a mouth with felt-tip pens. Cut small triangles from white paper for the teeth, then glue them along the mouth.
